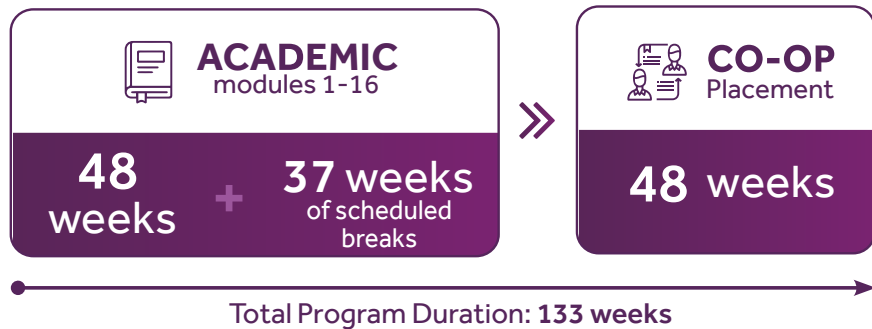
Becoming an industry leader....
