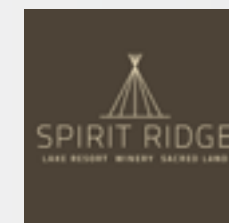

What can Student Services help you with?

- **School documents:** Enrolment letters, invitation letters, student finance statements and so on.
- **Housing and accommodation requests:** Housing resources and guidance.
- **School events and activities:** Career- and immigration-oriented webinars, as well as social activities for students.
- **Health insurance:** Information about setting up Medical Services Plan and/or applying for private insurance.
- **Mental health and wellness:** Resources available to you and how to use them.

Academic Special Requests

We understand that there are circumstances that are out of our control and we want you to know that you can ask for help in these situations. However, there are some rules that need to be followed when it comes to academic accommodations.

The following process only applies to illnesses or personal incidents that affect your attendance or academic performance when missing an exam or submitting an assignment late due to illness or accident.

Academic Special Request Process:

- Submit an Academic Special Request form to academics@canctb.ca (you may also request this form from Academics).
- You must submit within five business days of the incident.
- Include appropriate and relevant documentation, such as doctor's notes and medical exams (NOT drug prescriptions).

We will not accommodate if you:

- Have to go on a social trip/visit family.
- Have to go to work during school hours.
- Need accommodation due to unspecified reasons.
- Lack preparation or awareness of policies.
- Ask for accommodation after five business days from the incident.



Tips to Succeed in Your Studies



- **Set clear goals:** Having a clear objective will help you stay focused and motivated.
- **Time management:** Stay on top of your assignments, quizzes and exams.
- **Attendance:** Attend your classes and communicate any emergency absences as soon as possible.
- **Active participation:** Engage actively in class discussions, ask questions and participate in group activities.
- **Seek help:** Don't hesitate to ask questions to your professors, classmates and academic advisors if you are struggling to understand concepts or study effectively.
- **Academic standing:** Understand the requirements for maintaining good academic standing and successfully completing your program. Stay informed about grading policies, progression expectations, and necessary academic support resources. Visit our [Policies](#) webpage for more information.

Student Portal

Office 365

What is your Office 365 account?

Your Office 365 account provided by CCTB gives you access to the Microsoft Office 365 suite, including Word, Excel, PowerPoint, OneDrive and Teams. You can use these licensed apps at no extra cost while studying at CCTB. You also receive an email address to access these apps and personal cloud storage.

Go to <https://www.office.com> and log in with the credentials provided by the Academic department.

CCTB students will receive their Office 365 account within one week after their first semester begins. Graduates will have access to their Office 365 accounts for another six months after graduation.

Important: Students must use the Office 365 suite for all communication with the college. This means students using Teams to access online lectures and their CCTB Outlook account to email classmates and instructors.

Employment Rights

Understanding your rights as an employee in British Columbia is essential for ensuring fair wages and working conditions.

The [British Columbia Employment Standards Act](#) sets minimum standards for most workplaces, while certain occupations fall under the [Canada Labour Code](#). Both frameworks regulate key employment matters including:

- Minimum wage and wage deductions
- Overtime payment requirements
- Vacation leave
- Sick days
- Termination of employment

Staying in Canada after graduation

Your study permit will become invalid once you complete your studies. If you plan to stay in Canada, you must ensure you maintain valid immigration status.

As a Worker

Graduates of CCTB diploma programs are not eligible to apply for a post-graduation work permit (PGWP).

As a Student

If you wish to continue your studies and enhance your qualifications, you can apply to another program at CCTB or another Canadian institution that accepts international students. Admission requirements vary by program and institution. For more information, visit the [Changing Your School or Program](#) web page.

As a Visitor

If your study permit is set to expire and you want to stay in Canada temporarily as a visitor after completing your studies, you must apply for a [visitor record](#). You can submit an application online or by paper from within Canada to change your immigration status to “visitor”. This application must be submitted within 90 days of completing your program.

Applying for Permanent Resident Status

Some individuals choose to apply for permanent resident (PR) status after completing their studies. While this is an option for many graduates, eligibility requirements vary. Visit [Permanent Resident Cards and Status](#) for more information.

Please note: CCTB International Student Advisors are not authorized to provide PR application guidance. Students seeking immigration advice should consult a Regulated Canadian Immigration Consultant (RCIC) through the [College of Immigration and Citizenship Consultants \(CICC\)](#).



Cost of Living

Living expenses vary based on individual lifestyle and needs. As a student in Metro Vancouver, you should consider the following estimated costs:

EXPENSE	ESTIMATED COST (CAD)
Housing & Utilities	\$1,700 per month
Personal Expenses (groceries, entertainment, phone plan, hobbies, etc.)	\$700 per month
guard.me (student medical insurance)	\$180 for the first 90 days
Medical Services Plan (MSP) (Provincial Health Care Coverage – International Students Only)	\$75 per month

These estimates are intended to help you budget while studying in Metro Vancouver. Actual costs may vary based on personal choice and accommodation options.

Rental scams

It is important to be aware of fraudulent rental or sublet offers, typically from individuals posing as the owners/ landlords or tenants subletting a room — especially offers on non-registered websites such as Facebook, Craigslist, Kijiji, etc.

Red flags

- The price seems too good to be true.
- They request advance payment (before you’re able to see the property).
- They request a cash-only payment.
- They request a cash security deposit or wire transfer.
- They request extensive personal information that is not related to housing (e.g. SIN, bank account statements, criminal record check).

Tenant Rights

If you are new to renting in British Columbia (BC), it is important to understand your rights and responsibilities before signing a rental agreement (lease).

We strongly recommend visiting the [Tenant Resource & Advisory Centre \(TRAC\)](#) website, where you can access the [Tenant Survival Guide](#) and download letter templates for correspondence with your landlord. TRAC also offers a free online course, [Renting it Right](#), in partnership with the [Justice Education Society of BC](#)—an excellent introduction to renting in BC.

How to Pay Fees

CIBC International Student Pay

The Canadian College of Technology and Business has partnered with CIBC to offer international and domestic students a secure, cost-efficient and convenient way to pay for their study expenses.

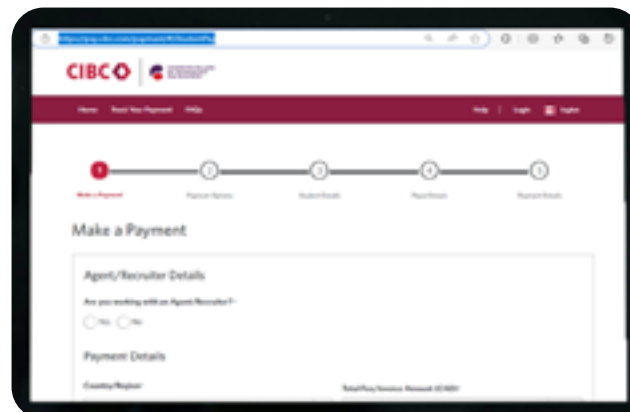

- **Flexible payment options:** Choose from a range of payment methods, including wire transfer, MasterCard, Visa, Direct Debit (USA), China Union Pay and e-wallets like AliPay and WeChat Pay (China).



Online card payment

CCTB students can pay tuition fees using their own or a sponsor's (family, friends or guardian) card. To make a payment, simply complete the online payment form available on the CCTB website. Please note that a 2 per cent transaction fee applies to all online card payments.

Terms:

Credit card: Issued by banks or financial institutions, credit cards allow you to make purchases in person and online. Unlike debit cards, purchases made with a credit card must be paid back. If the balance isn't paid by the billing deadline, interest will be charged.

Debit card: Linked directly to your bank account, debit cards allow for instant payment by withdrawing funds from your account when making a purchase.

Other ways to manage your money: Many banks offer mobile banking apps for easy account management. Some apps even provide insights into your spending habits, helping you stay on top of your finances. Be sure to download the app for your financial institution.

Interac e-Transfer

Paying your tuition via Interac e-Transfer is one of the fastest and most convenient options, available for transactions in Canada.

Instructions:

1. Find your CCTB student number.
2. Open your mobile banking app and select the Interac e-Transfer option.
3. Address the e-transfer to studentpayments@canadianctb.ca.
4. In the message section, include your student number and specify what you're paying for.
5. After completing the transaction, please send a screenshot to studentfinance@canadianctb.ca.



Important Transit Information

Transit App

Vancouver's public transportation system, including buses and SkyTrain, can be easily navigated using the Transit app. This app offers real-time schedules, arrival times and detailed route information.

Compass Card

The Compass Card is a reloadable fare card for use on Metro Vancouver's public transit. It can be loaded with prepaid passes (like Monthly or DayPasses) or with stored value.

How does Compass Card work?

- Tap your card on the reader when entering buses, HandyDART, SkyTrain stations or SeaBus terminals.
- The fare is automatically deducted from the stored value on your card.
- Riders with Monthly DayPasses need to tap to validate their pre-paid trip.
- Each rider must have a separate payment method; you cannot use one card to pay for multiple fares on the same trip. At a Compass Vending Machine (CVM), you can use your Compass Card to buy a ticket for a different rider.

Uber and taxis are popular and reliable transportation options for getting around the city.

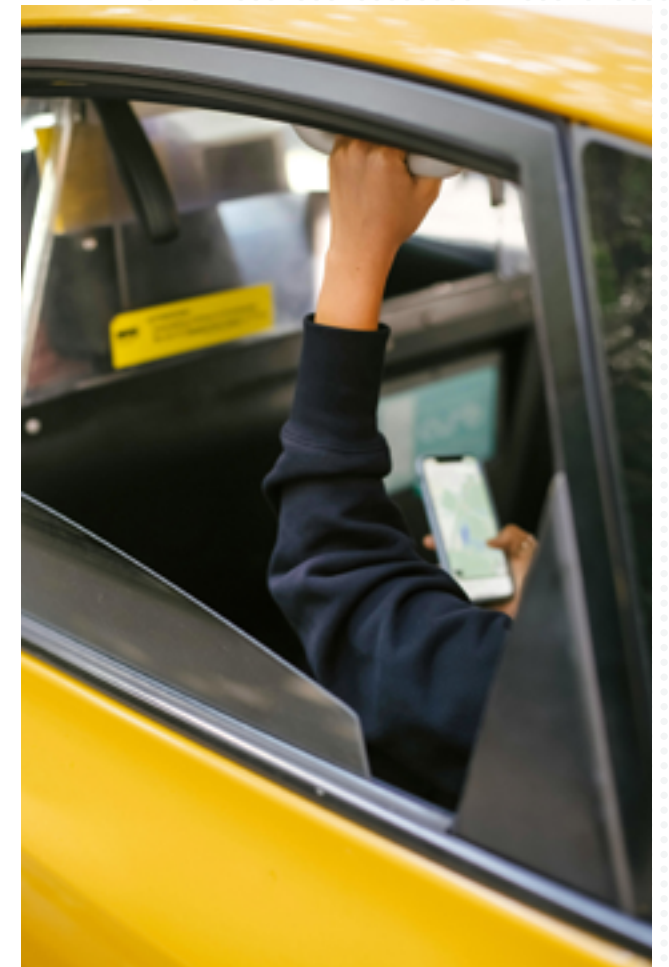

How to apply for part-time jobs

Students with a study permit can work part-time in Canada if they meet the following requirements:

- Valid study permit
- Social insurance number (SIN)
- Enrolled as a full-time post-secondary student at a designated learning institution (DLI).

When searching for part-time jobs in Canada, ensure your resume includes educational transcripts, skills, experiences and achievements.
